This application can only be submitted by one of the following methods:

- In-Person You can deliver your application in person to the Early Voting Clerk. Only you, the applicant, can use this option; no other person is authorized to do it for you.
- By Mail You can mail your application via the U.S. Postal Service (USPS).
- Common or Contract Carrier You can send your application using a bona fide, for-profit carrier.
- Fax or E-Mail Transmission You can fax or e-mail an electronic copy of your application to the Early Voting Clerk. Read the Application Instructions for additional rules. Contact your Early Voting Clerk or the Secretary of State for fax and e-mail information.

#### When do I need a witness?

You need a witness if you cannot write your signature with an ink pen on the application. The witness is verifying that you, the voter, are submitting this application.

You can have more than one assistant, or an assistant and a witness.

They must fill out the Assistant/Witness section of the application.

I helped someone complete this application. Am I an Assistant or a Witness?

You are an **assistant** if you helped the voter complete this form, or if you mailed, emailed, or faxed this application on behalf of the voter.

You are a **witness** if you watched the voter sign or mark in the Voter Signature box, or you are affirming that the voter is unable to sign.

If you are doing **both** at the same time, check the box for "Both".

#### I'm an Assistant or a Witness—what are the rules?

- You must complete the Assistant/Witness section of the application. It is a Class A Misdemeanor to help someone complete this application without providing this information.
- You must state your relationship to the voter. If you are not a relative, you must state that.
- You must check the correct boxes to show what kind of help you provided.
- If the voter is unable to make a mark, you must check the box to show that.
- You should date the application in the Voter Signature box, but **DO NOT SIGN FOR THE VOTER IN THE VOTER SIGNATURE BOX**.
- You cannot act as a witness for more than one application in each election. You cannot act as a
  witness for more than one Annual Application in a calendar year. Doing so is a Class B
  Misdemeanor.

### **Application Instructions & FAQs 2**

#### I want to fax or e-mail my application. What else should I know?

If you submit an electronic copy of your application, you must also submit the original paper copy. If you do not send the paper copy, your application will be rejected.

The paper copy must be received by the Early Voting Clerk no later than the close of business on the fourth business day after the electronic copy is received.

Both the electronic copy and the paper copy must show your signature in ink. Electronic signatures are not permitted, even on the electronic copy. Stamps and photocopies are also not permitted.

#### When is the deadline to submit my application?

Your application must be received by the Early Voting Clerk no later than 11 days **before** Election Day. If this day falls on a weekend or holiday, then the deadline moves to the first preceding business day.

You can submit your application at any time on or after January 1, for any election during the calendar year. Your application will only be valid if it is received at least 11 days before Election Day.

If you are submitting an Annual Application, you can submit your application **within 60 days** of an election that takes place in the following calendar year. For example, if there is a special election on January 30, you can submit an Annual Application on December 2. This rule **only** applies to Annual Applications, and **only** if there is an election within 60 days of the date your application is received.

# I don't qualify for an Annual Application, but I want to vote in more than one election. Do I need to apply again every time?

Yes. If you do not qualify for an Annual Application, you need to submit a separate application for every election that you want to vote in. An election and resulting runoff count as one election for the purposes of this application, so choose the correct boxes if you want to vote in both.

If you want to vote by mail because you will be **Absent From the County** during multiple elections (for example, college students), you can fill out an application for each election and submit them all at the same time. You will still need to fill out the **Dates of Absence** section on every application.

#### I'm in jail or a civil commitment facility, do I qualify to vote by mail?

If you are confined in jail, or subject to involuntary civil commitment under Chapter 841 of the Health and Safety Code, you can vote by mail if at least one of the following is true at the time you submit this application:

- You are serving a misdemeanor sentence, and your term will end on or after Election Day.
- You are jailed pending trial after denial of bail.
- You are jailed without bail pending appeal of a felony conviction.
- You are jailed pending trial or appeal, on a bailable offense, and it is unlikely that you will be released on bail before Election Day.
- You have been involuntarily civilly committed under Chapter 841 of the Health and Safety Code.
